EPA Renovation, Repair, and Painting Program for Contractors Lead Certified Firm

The Lead Renovation, Repair, and Painting (LRRP) rule establishes requirements for firms and individuals performing renovations, and directly impacts contractors, property managers, and others who disturb painted surfaces. It applies to work in houses, apartments, and child-occupied facilities (such as schools and day-care centers) built before 1978. It includes pre-renovation education requirements as well as training, firm certification and work practice requirements.



Firm Responsibilities

Firms performing renovations must ensure that:

- All individuals performing activities that disturb painted surfaces on behalf of the firm are either certified renovators or have been trained by a certified renovator.
- A certified renovator is assigned to each renovation and performs all of the certified renovators responsibilities.
- All renovations performed by the firm are performed in accordance with the work practice standards of the Lead-Based Paint Renovation, Repair, and Painting Program.
- Pre-renovation education and lead pamphlet distribution requirements of the Lead-Based Paint Renovation, Repair, and Painting Program are performed.
- The program's recordkeeping requirements are met.
